Vanjaar se kersie-klingel Kom na Ficksburg en vang Kersiekoors is van toepassing en die program is uiteenlopend maar met die gewone vermaak wat van die Kersiefees so 'n gesogte oesfees maak.

Christiaan van Zyl, deurwinterde Oos-Vrystaatse sanger het pas sy eerste CD die lig laat sien en hulle sal by die Kersiefees te koop wees terwyl hy sy stem en kitaar sal laat saam dans op maat van die Cherry-wals. Hy sal die verhoog deel met kunstenaars soos Andriette Norman, Gerhard Steyn, Ray Dylan en Monique.

Die gewildste item op Saterdagoggend se program is natuurlik die steil voetpad op teen die Imperani-berg as deel van die 23 energietappende kilometers oor die bekendste baken in Ficksburg. Die marathon spring 07:00 weg net na die bergfietse wat 06:30 die pad vat. Die bergfietsresies word gereël deur Boet du Toit. Bel hom by 084 600 4519.

Kersietoere na die oorsprong van al die lekkerte, die omliggende en kersieproduserende plase word elke dag van die fees onderneem. Kersies in alle vorme word dan aangebied: vars, geglasuur, in konfyt en dan natuurlik die immer gewilde likeur.

Ficksburg se Tafelronde (Round Tablers) is verantwoordelik vir die biertent en almal kan verseker wees van 'n gesellige fees en niemand hoef op te droog waar daar kersie-sider of sommer gewone kersiesap ook sal wees nie.

Die grootste aantrekkingskrag van die fees is natuurlik die klein rooi vruggie maar omdat aspersies terselfdertyd gepluk word, word dié lekkerny vars en vrolik, of gaar en geblik opgedis en die twee oeste het nou al sinoniem van mekaar geword.

Die kersiepitspoegkompetisie is ook so eie aan die Kersiefees as wat rooi en groen is, want 'n groot deel van kersies eet is die uitspoeg van die klein harde pitjie. Die kompetisie lok jaarliks talle inskrywings en sorg vir groot pret.

Verder vul die letterlik honderde stalletjies en perdevertonings en nogeens musiek en lekker kos deur vaardige hande berei, die dae van die fees. Abba se Magic Show beloof om baie aftrek te kry maar so ook die suutjies trap van spogperd en -karretjie. Die kampioenskappe word jaarliks hier aangebied en nostalgie omvou die fees vir 'n wyle wanneer vervloë dae in herinnering geroep word.

Daar is ook vermaak vir die kinders met meganiese sweef-en rygoed maar gewoonlik kry die begeleide perderitte ook groot aftrek.


Like the little robin who sings his passion and the flowers that give off their heavenly scent.

When it was the turn of the pupils of the Clarens Primary School to perform, the audience doubled in size and they swayed to the music of Michael Jackson. Annatjie Coetzee, Erika van Rensburg and the team coached the learners to render a melodramatic version of the musician's work to the sheer enjoyment of the audience. This was just a curtain raiser to the main event, the school's annual music revue, which took place on 26 October.

The executive mayor of Dihlabeng Councillor Tjhetane Mofokeng and MEC of Tourism Clem Harrington received the cheque on behalf of the Clarens Tourism Forum

and Mayor Mofokeng granted in his speech that retaining the award was the difficult part, but said that he was quite convinced that Dihlabeng would continue to produce winners.

Wisely and for safety sake, it was decided to have the beer drinking contest in the marquee on the square in Clarens.
















## Die einde van die storie ...

maar juis die begin

"Die geskiedenis van shweshwe loop wyd en ver. Adél
Steyn het dié brokkie geskienis, wat amper ongesiens
verbygegaan het, gaan opdiep en vir ons hier kom
weergee."

In die beginjare aan die Kaap van Goeie Hoop het die slawe-, Khoisan- en Voortrekkervroue almal rokke gedra van 'n pragtige gedrukte indigo-materiaal. Die oorsprong van hierdie lap het gelê in Oos-Europa sowel as Indië, waarvandaan die blou kleurstof gekom het. Toe die Duitse setlaars in ongeveer 1858 in die Oos-Kaap kennis maak met hierdie materiaal, wat sterk herinner het en histories verwant was aan hulle eie Blaudruck, het ook hulle begin om daarvan klere te maak. So het die lap in die volksmond bekend geword as Duitse sis. Kort voor lank het dit ook die Xhosa-vroue se verbeelding aangegryp, en het die ouer en getroude vroue dit by spesiale geleenthede saam met hulle rooi kombersmateriaal begin dra. Hulle het hierdie kledingstuk uJamani genoem, 'n woord waarmee hulle erkenning gegee het aan die Duitse gebruikers van die lap ("uGerman"), en wat beteken "die einde van die storie". Maar nadat die kreatiewe Xhosa-vroue hulle Afrika-stempel op hierdie Europees-Indiese lap afgedruk het, was dit inderdaad net die begin van 'n baie mooi storie. Want vandag word rokke van shweshwe, soos dit nou bekendstaan, in enige kleur en fatsoen deur vroue oral in Suid-Afrika gedra.

Shweshwe is aanvanklik in die historiese Tsjeggo-Slowakye, Hongarye en toe in Engeland vervaardig. Die produksie daarvan in die bekende blou, bruin en rooi kleure soos ons dit vandag ken, het in 1982 in Suid-Afrika begin, en Da Gama Textiles het die alleenreg vir die druk daarvan in 1992 gekoop. Die koperrollers, met die verskillende patrone op die oppervlak daarvan geëts, is van Engeland na Suid-Afrika verskeep, en is steeds vandag in gebruik.

Die geheim vir die styfheid van ongewaste shweshwe lê in hierdie stukkie geskiedenis opgesluit. Die lap moes destyds, voor die vervaardiging daarvan op eie bodem, met stysel behandel word om die klam toestande op die skeepsreise te oorleef. Jy sal dus, deur net aan die materiaal te voel, weet wanneer jy met ware shweshwe te doen het. Maar as jy steeds twyfel, dop die lap om. Shweshwe, wat terloops, van suiwer katoen gemaak word, word vervaardig in die bekende Three Cats-reeks, en jy sal die watermerk van die drie katte, Three Leopards, Toto of Fancy Print aan die binnekant van die lap vind.

Shweshwe het sy buiging as modemateriaal in 2003 gemaak, maar dit bly sedertdien in aanvraag. Suid-Afrikaanse ontwerpers soos Amanda Laird Cherry, Bongiwe Walaza en Marianne Fassler se shweshwe-geïnspireerde ontwerpe het hierdie trots Suid-Afrikaanse produk tot in Parys en New York geneem. Vandag is shweshwe selfs in aanvraag by Amerikaanse kwilters, en word dit in 'n magdom ander produkte gebruik: van kussings, boekomslae, lampskerms, plekmatjies en yskasmagnete, tot hondekomberse, kinderklere en selfs speelgoed. Onder die vaandel van Shwe Shwe Poppis in Soweto maak vroue van daardie gemeenskap unieke shweshwe-poppies waarvan die ontwerpe gebaseer is op oorspronklike kindertekeninge. Shweshwe is ook vandag beskikbaar in ander kleure soos pienk en pers, wat dit 'n nuwe en speelse karakter gee en nog meer gebruiksmoontlikhede open.

Volgens legende het Franse sendelinge in 1840 aan koning Moshoeshoe I'n stuk van die indigo- materiaal as geskenk gegee, en so het dit gekom dat die lap eers shoeshoe, en later shweshwe geheet het. 'n Ander verklaring vir dié mooi-klinkende naam is dat die Xhosa-vroue dit so genoem het na die swiepgeluid van die rompe om hul bene.

Hoe dit ook al sy, vandag is ons bly dat hierdie vroue vir ons met naald en gare die begin van 'n baie mooi storie geskryf het. Suid-Afrika se diverse kultuurgeskiedenis loop soos 'n bont katoendraad deur die storie van shweshwe, sodat hierdie besonderse materiaal nou 'n kosbare erfenisskat geword het. En shweshwe het lankal reeds sy weg grasieus vanaf die kus tot in die hart van die Oos-Vrystaat gebaan, waar ook trotse Sotho- en Zoeloe-vroue vandag met daardie sagte swiep om hul heupe gesien word. Daar moet 'n betowering wees aan 'n stof teen jou vel so bekoorlik en met so 'n ryk geskiedenis.

Komaan, word deel van die tradisie. Koop shweshwe. Gee 'n shweshwegeskenk, verfraai jou huis daarmee; wys jou ware kleure en dra dit self! Skryf saam aan een van die mooiste stories van hoop in die wêreld. My rok hang reeds in my kas, en joune?

# Die grotman bly kordaat

In die derde aflewering in ons reeks oor die legendariese Andries (alias Caveman) Spies, daag hy in Europa wild en wakker boksers uit en maak amok.

3 1225 In Stockholm was daar 'n relletjie wat baie tipies van Andries was. Die taal was 'n bietjie van 'n probleem toe die skeidsregter die geveg teen Anders Anderson na die derde ronde probeer stop omdat Anderson uit was op sy voete. Spies kon nie verstaan wat aangaan nie, want die man staan dan nog. Toe die skeidsregter aan hom pluk om sy boodskap deur te kry vererg Caveman hom. Toe slaan hy sommer dié ook uit. Van die toeskouers en beamptes takel hom toe, maar ook hulle het vir Spies onderskat. Hy het glo by die hotel aangekom met net sy boksbroekie en -handskoene aan.

Hy het ook in Holland, België en in Frankryk geveg voordat hy Duitsland toe is. Daar was dit dieselfde storie totdat sy reputasie die opponente laat opdroog het.

Andries besluit toe maar om vir Max Schmeling uit te daag. Schmeling was die nuwe swaargewig-wêreldkampioen, en het geweier om teen die onbekende Suid-Afrikaner te veg. Die volgende oggend is Andries by Schmeling se oefenkamp met nog 'n uitdaging. Maar die Duitser wil niks weet nie.

Twee weke later is Andries weer daar en toe willig die wêreldkampioen in om privaat teen hom te baklei, vir 500 mark.

Dit was glo gelykstaande aan die totale bedrag wat Andries tot in daardie stadium in Europa bymekaargemaak en in 'n geldband om sy lyf gedra het. Andries Spies vertel self: "Toe ek in my gewone gebukkende houding kom, slaan hy my kop terug met 'n geweldige kort regterhaakhou, en daarna onthou ek nie veel nie. Behalwe dat dit vir 'n minuut of twee bokshandskoene gereën het, tot die genadiglike verlossing van bewusteloosheid. Dit was die slegste pak wat ek nog gekry het, maar ek het ten minste die voorreg gehad om die bekende Schmeling te ontmoet. Dit was die moeite werd, hy was 'n goeie sport, want ek is vol bier en Rynwyn hotel toe, met 'n allemintige 1 000 mark in my sak. Schmeling het my die ander 500 mark ook gegee."

Toe is Andries Rusland in, maar sonder 'n visum. Hy is gou ontdek en teruggestuur sonder dat hy daar geveg het. In Spanje het hy die "Baskiese Stoeier", Antoine Germatte, in die eerste ronde uitgeslaan. Toe droog die opponente weer op, en hy begin dink aan bulgevegte. In Toledo het hy na een gaan kyk, en vertel:

"Ek het al enigiets in my lewe probeer, meesal net een keer, maar nadat ek een bulgeveg gesien het, het ek besluit dis bokant my vuurmaakplek."

In Frankryk is Leon Cartout gediskwalifiseer omdat hy vir Caveman gebyt het, en daarna is Andries, ná agtien gevegte op die vasteland, weer terug Engeland toe. Hy was nou bekend en 'n rits uitdagings van beter opponente het op hom gewag. Dinge was net aan die regkom toe kry hy 'n erge griep, en doen asma op, 'n kwaal wat hom sy lewe lank sou bybly. Dit het hom veral in die Engelse weer gekortwiek en hy het besluit om terug te kom.

Terug in Suid-Afrika het hy uitstekend geveg totdat hy op 'n dag sleg teen die ervare en swaarder Tommy Holdstock verloor het. Andries het besluit dis tyd om iets nuuts te probeer. Rofstoei het intussen baie populêr geword, en dit het natuurlik sy ekstroverte persoonlikheid en ongewone krag soos 'n handskoen gepas. Hy het dit uit die aard van die saak ook baie geniet.

Andries en 'n Rus met die naam Boganzki, het 'n reeks gevegte oor die lengte en breedte van die land gehad, en ook groot vriende geword. Die promotor het die Caveman-legende goed uitgebuit. Hy is by elke nuwe bestemming so 'n paar myl buite die stad of dorp afgelaai voor die geveg sou plaasvind, sodat Caveman net voor die geveg papnat gesweet met sy fiets opdaag, al die pad van Harrismith af! 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











# Trust a never-ending story

Thanks to CAT, Makoti beat the odds and Dusty stays upbeat

The Cluny Animal Trust (CAT) that was founded earlier this year to provide care for animals whose owners can't afford veterinary services is holding out a lifeline to animals that would never have made it without care.

Initiator of the trust Dr Kathrine Barker shared the stories of two dogs that would have been doomed had they not received the necessary treatment. Dr Barker is a veterinary practitioner in Fouriesburg.

Makoti, an Africanis of indeterminate age, was brought in 10 days ago after being poisoned with a rodenticide left out by the neighbours. She had been vomiting blood and passing blood in her stool.

She was hospitalised and treated for poisoning, but despite medical treatment continued to deteriorate until her abdomen was filled with blood. With her chances of survival at zero without dangerous surgery to stop the bleeding and her chances of surviving surgery negligible, her owners begged me to save her life.

So into theatre she went -her clotting ability grave. I opened her up resulting in a pool of blood from her abdomen soaking into numerous towels around her, and found her uterus filled past capacity with blood that it had ruptured, causing more blood vessels to bleed, including major ones. Not having a suction pump in theatre (put that on my wish list!) I started to mop through more than two litres of blood to clear the area and find the major bleeders, which I managed, with much sweat and a few tears.

After removing the uterus, I could close her up with only seeping of blood into the surgical site. This was controlled with a pressure bandage. For three days and nights she was kept under heavy sedation, and gently turned every few hours, even during the night, while vitamin K and liver support was administered with her drips.

To everyone in the hospital's surprise and great relief, Makoti pulled through and is recovering well with on-going treatment -a bit pale and wan, but eating well and very demonstrative in her appreciation. Her treatment to date, if charged at normal vet rates would be in excess of R5 500, for which the owners have promised to pay R500, leaving a deficit of R1 500 just to cover direct costs. This is where the Cluny Animal Trust helps indigent people, covering those costs that they cannot afford.

Dusty is also in hospital at the moment. She is a seven-month-old Africanis, who was brought in because she was not eating, and one of her legs was "growing crooked". The dog had a fever of 40,5°C, septic arthritis in her right front wrist joint, broken radius and ulna of this leg, and a broken tibia and fibula of her right hind leg, shown by x-rays under anaesthetic.

Dusty has now been with me for three weeks in Robert Jones bandages and treated for her infection. She gets around just great on her two good legs and bandages, but needs the dressings changed every 10 to 14 days, as she is still growing, and in her exuberance, wears out the foot of the bandages. Each time we do this, Dusty has to go under anaesthetic, as she will not keep still for the procedure.


So far, this would normally have cost in the region of R3 500, but CAT is paying the balance of R1 900 that the owner cannot pay, to cover direct costs of the x-rays, multiple anaesthetics, bandaging materials, antibiotics, pain killers and food.

A maximum of 60 people can be accommodated in the new bush camp, while the top campsite can accommodate 20 campers and is used for one- or two-nighters. The top camp has a very quaint little ablution facility and the site is all grassed and close to the other amenities. Every site has a power point.

For the children there are swings under the trees, stunning walks to the dam for a swim, excellent cycle tracks, and hours of fun can be had in the river. Horse riding and Quad hire is available on the farm. Shumba offers a great 12km 4x4 track with a number of thought-provoking obstacles. Above the cottages is a farm Resevoir converted to a plunge pool with a wooden deck on one side for a dip on those really hot days.

A few visits to the nearby Clarens with its stunning art galleries, interesting little shops and a delightful quantity of superb restaurants, are a must. For golfers, there is a beautiful course. White-water rafting is done on the Ash River just outside of Clarens; dinosaur footprint trails can be walked in Clarens and visitors simply have to drive to the Golden Gate National Park. Pop across the border for a day exploring Lesotho and the impressive Katse Dam, Bokong Nature Reserve, or drive up to the ski resort that offers good 4x4 trails in the summer months.

Firewood is available on site and there is DSTV for rugby mad visitors! Fouriesburg is only 8kms away with two excellent butcheries, three great restaurants and a wonderful new shopping centre. Grocery shopping is limited but there are two good bottle stores. Beer, biltong and braaivleis and who needs more! Grocery chain stores are available in Ficksburg or in Bethlehem.

# Caring for the valley

Gregg Mousley, chairperson of the Clarens Conservancy, spoke to us about the successes and the difficulties of running a conservancy in an area with very diverse interests and priorities.

In its 26 years of existence, the Clarens Conservancy has seen an about turn in the extinction of fauna and flora in the valley with various species finding their way back to where they once were prevalent.

With increased environmental awareness and with Clarens attaining star status in the tourism industry, a group of farmers from the Clarens Valley founded the conservancy in 1985 with the intention of preserving the natural resources of the area. The conservancy was incorporated into Free State Nature Conservation and a delegation of local farmers visited conservancies in Natal for guidance on how to conduct a conservancy. Initially, some 12–14 members in the Clarens area joined and contributed on a voluntary basis.

The number of members has increased over the years from 8 to 16 and the conservancy now employs four permanent trained guards to do the legwork in the field. Two of these guards have been with the conservancy virtually since inception.

All the selfless efforts are now paying off and signs that nature is returning to glory are there for all to see.



#### Among the mammals:

- There has been a noticeable increase in the grey duiker population, as can be seen when one goes out with a spotlight at night. Previously, these animals were mercilessly hunted with dogs;
- The numbers of the Stevenson's rock rabbit have increased, since they too are no longer hunted extensively;
- African wildcats, which used to be indiscriminately killed in the early days because they preyed on poultry, can now be seen even at daytime; and the genet population has also increased dramatically;
- Serval is seen on a regular basis and is often excitedly reported as leopard!
- When one takes a walk along a river or dam, the tracks and dung of otters are visible;
- The aardwolf, which appeared to be just about extinct, has also increased in numbers;
- A new resident is the slender mongoose that didn't stand a chance until the conservancy days. Its cousin the grey mongoose has also benefited; and
- Even the much-persecuted jackal and porcupine have benefited.

Birdlife is picking up nicely and some of the new birds that have come to the valley are the large spur-winged goose, southern bou bou, two species of lapwings, Greenwood hoopoe and the longcrested eagle. These birds would never have come here if the environment was not looked after.

"By re-establishing the food chain, we have even managed to bring back to our area a pair of Verreaux's Eagles, a speci that had been gone for the past ten years.

"In co-operation with SAFRING and the Bethlehem Bird Ringers group we did a number of bird ringing or banding sessions in the conservancy area.

We have been doing raptor rehabilitation and relocation for the past seven years and in this year have released more than 70 rehabilitated birds of prey into our conservancy," says Gregg.

Reptiles are also protected and these benefactors released 20 mountain tortoises into the conservancy area with the guards monitoring them.

A survey of dogs in the valley has shown very few greyhound-type hunting dogs, a real threat to fauna, and those are carefully watched.

Other steps are taken to make the valley a safer place for its rightful inhabitants, and snares are being removed, which means that almost no animals are now strangled to death on a fence. The monitoring of skins and animal parts too has all but eradicated the muti trade in animals and plants in the conservancy area. Another challenge, namely that of wild animals being kept as pets, is being resolved by monitoring permits for these animals and educating the owners about the law.

The guards have been instrumental in crime prevention over this period and have made more than 100 arrests that have ranged from poaching fish to stock theft. They work with the police on an continuous basis and are a valuable asset to the security in our valley.

"These are the visible battles we have won not to mention the smaller battles won. Like insects, this will then attract the insect eaters to the valley" Gregg added.





In addition, the conservancy has been of great educational value and, with the help of Jan Lesale from Free State Nature Conservation, the guards did education among residents. Gregg says their guards have been on numerous training courses with Free State Nature Conservation. Sadly however involvement from the Department's side has all but dried up over the last years as they feel the pressure from lack of funds and running vehicles. Despite this the conservancy has a very good relationship with the department and we communicate on a regular basis.


The committee and members too have attended several seminars on conservation and have worked hand in hand with Nature Conservation for all this time to preserve the environment. All this was done at their own expense, in their own time and for no remuneration. Representing the view of all members, Gregg says the reward has been in the successes he told us about.


We have recently managed to get the approval from FS Nature Conservation on an eland management plan. With their help the conservancy is now issued a permit from the department and the committee then distributes the permit amongst the members who are affected by eland and we then sell off the remainder as a fundraiser. In this way we attempt to share the resource as well as raise much needed funds.

He assures us that the conservancy is in it for the long haul. "We are building up a data bank of photographs of all the conservancy work for the next generation to take over in order to ensure the long-term protection of our valley from exploitation."

The conservancy has several hiking trails and an overnight hut for hikers to enjoy the beauty of the area at an affordable price. These hikes are well worth the effort and bookings can be done with Annali on 073 050 8030.

# Robert Badenhorst Gallery on Main Street An amazing maze

This complex offers established and young artists the opportunity to exhibit in a communal environment, making it bliss for art lovers.

Developed by Bruce Weyer, the man who enjoys being brand named the man who put Clarens on the map, the gallery (nicknamed the Rabbit Warren), is situated across the street from Richard Rennie's gallery. 

grasperk nie.



# It's a paradise out there

The Eastern Free State is home to many wild flowers and there are various ways to explore these. Wim Wybenga writes about some of the flowers one is likely to come across in the hills and fields of the area highlighting it with outstanding photographs. Wandering in the veldt this time of year, you might have noticed a very sweet fragrance but were unable to spot the flower, that is because it is so tiny and from a distance quite insignificant (only 3mm in diameter). The Firesticks (*Diospyros austro-africana var rubriflora*) is a shru or small tree that bears hundreds of little perfumed

flowers attracting a variety of flying insects. Up close at macro level (1:1)

the infinite detail and different hues of salmon pink is quite inspiring. The vernacular name refers to the use of its dried twigs by later stone-age mountain Bushmen for the making of fire by friction, since the plant contains a variety of inflammable oils.

On sandstone cliffs and boulders the purple and blue shades of the Blue Scilla (Merwilla plumbea) brings new life to the dry grasslands that have since been discoloured by the long winter frosts. Its conspicuously large bulbs are a source of various traditional medicines, including the dressing of fractures and wounds since it contains anti-inflammatory and analgesic compounds. Internal use is not recommended, however, since it is slightly toxic. Because of over-exploitation in Kwazulu-Natal it has become an endangered (red listed) species, it's also listed as a protected plant in the Free State.

As sunset approaches, the reminiscent smell of narcissi can become quite intoxicating with the yellow heads of the 'Harige Gifbossie' (translated as the *hairy poison bush*) emanating its attractive fragrance to unsuspecting pollinating insects like hawk moths. The scientific name is *Gnidia burchelli*. It's reported to be poisonous to livestock, although they rarely feed on the plant. Interestingly, it's usually only the offspring that is affected by the toxins, creating deformities and deaths in juvenile animals. If you can put two and two together: the plant occurs mostly in disturbed and overgrazed areas. Isn't it wonderful how God created nature to keep itself in balance! A local field guide Mr Neil van Schalkwyk notes that Basotho people chew the plant for the relief of toothache. One of his clients, a dentist from Pretoria had plant material analysed, and confirmed the presence of analgesic compounds.

Lastly on my menu of wild flowers, the various everlastings (Helichrysum spp) are beginning to open up again and what a display! In the Clarens valley there are close to 40 species, some with less conspicuous inflorescences, but still of important medicinal value. At Witzieshoek Mountain Resort in QwaQwa, you'll find thousands of pink, red and yellow ones coming into flower round November.

# Davelsrust-begraafplaas vertel Katie se verhaal

Die stamvader van die Bruwer-familie in Suid-Afrika was Estienne (Bruere) Bruwer van Blois wat op 13 April 1688 as een van die eerste Franse Hugenote aan die Kaap land. Hy het net een seun gehad wat afstammelinge nagelaat het. Sy naam was Johannes Bruwer en dié se nasate word in drie takke verdeel. Die Schalk Willemse Bruwer-tak trek in 1838 saam na Natal waar baie die lewe laat tydens die slag van Bloedrivier.

Johannes Jacobus Bruwer (13/03/1870-20/09/1943) oorleef Bloedrivier maar neem afskeid van die ander Bruwers en trek saam met die familie Du Plessis wat hy in Natal leer ken het, terug Vrystaat toe. Die Du Plessis-gesin vestig hulle by Reitz, maar J.J. trek verder en hy en sy mense gaan bly in die Brandfort-distrik.

Anna Catharina of Katie, soos almal haar genoem het, het J.J. se oog gevang en hulle trou op 27 Maart 1898, sowat 18 maande voor die Anglo-Boere-oorlog uitbreek.

Hulle oudste seun, Johannes Jacobus word 'n jaar na hulle troue gebore en is sewe maande oud toe die oorlog uitbreek en sy vader na die front aan Natal opgeroep word.

Vir die eerste maande van die oorlog bly

Katie en haar seuntjie alleen op die plaas, maar hulle huis word as deel van die verskroeide-aarde-beleid afgebrand en hulle na die konsentrasiekamp in Bloemfontein geneem.

J.J. word tydens die Surrender Hilloorgawe gevange geneem en na Ceylon gestuur. Die gesin sou eers weer in 1903 herenig word.

Toestande in Brandfort was haglik ná die oorlog en oorlogsvergoeding minimaal. J.J. het besluit om sy grond te verkoop en na sy oom in die Bethlehem-distrik te trek om in die Oos-Vrystaat 'n nuwe lewe te begin. Hulle woon as bywoners op Bruwershoop, 'n plaas net buite Bethlehem en hier word Katie se drie dogters gebore.

Toe Davelsrust op die mark kom, kon hulle dit koop en die gesinnetjie 'n ware nuwe begin maak met 'n nuwe sandsteenhuis eerste op die lys.

Dit is egter nie die einde van Katie se droefheid nie. Haar man word weer tydens die Rebellie aangehou en sy en haar vyftienjarige seun is weer alleen om na die plaas en die jonger kinders om te sien, maar gelukkig nie vir lank nie en hulle kon weer die onderbreekte bouery hervat

Op vyftigjarige ouderdom voltooi J.J. die sandsteenhuis op Davelsrust. Sy seun J.J. nou 21 jaar oud, het gehelp met die enorme taak. Bokant die voordeur word J.J. Bruwer 1920 uitgekap en so word pa en seun se handewerk vir die nageslag bewaar.

In 1918 tydens die Groot Griep sterf drie van Johannes se susters. Die jongste enetjie was drie maande oud. Maar Katie bly sterk staan en verloor haar man na 45 jaar getroude lewe en net vier jaar later begrawe sy haar seun in dieselfde rooi grond van Davelsrust. Na sewe jaar van alleenwees het haar oorblywende kinders haar langs haar eggenoot begrawe.
















### All roads lead through Clarens



Next year, Clarens will be hosting the MG Club's 50th anniversary while Steel Wings will be enjoying their annual outride to Clarens in this month.





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I have been a regular visitor to the Clarens region for a number of years. My first real photographic trip was in April 1994. I accompanied a group of photographers to the region as a young wide-eyed beginner, and was in awe of the phenomenal landscapes that seemed to endlessly unfold at every turn. I can recall one member of our group voting at the voting station set up just opposite the Van Blerk farm, Rendezvous.

Most of the landscapes presented themselves from the immediacy of the main road that connects Clarens with Fouriesburg. This 30-odd kilometre ribbon of roadway has continued to provide me unabated opportunity to photograph spectacular landscapes on every occasion that I have revisited the area. I have grown to rely on this roadway for a continued

flow of photographic opportunities. I have never been disappointed.

On most visits to the area, I have lodged at Lesoba farm, some 10 km from Fouriesburg. From here, the R711 (Maloti Route) is easily accessible and I have pounded the tarmac innumerable times in pursuit of yet another great shot. Iconic elements such as the small dam with a row of submerged poplars within it located just outside Fouriesburg; the distinct and well known butte located to the west of the Oranje farm; and the magnificent valley that lies at the foot of the Malutis to the south of Surrender Hill are only three of many landscape elements that make this roadway so well known. I have photographed these and others many times, with no two images ever being "the same". The unique play of light and subtle colours ensures that all features that I have encountered along the roadway have presented themselves differently and provided challenging and ultimately very satisfying opportunities.

The relationship that I have established with the roadway is one that continues to bring me back year after year. Not only the immediate access to great landscapes, but the wonderful people who live and work along the roadway that I have met and revisited together with their hospitality and long suffering acceptance of my trespassing on their land have ensured

that there will always be a special place in me for it.

The R711or Maloti Route has been the backbone and central conduit to many interesting and fruitful sojourns onto adjoining farms. I have thought little of stopping along or indeed turning off the roadway to access an intriguing landscape. Not once have I been confronted or ordered to vacate the property I was on. All that I have been required to do was make a friendly request to photograph on the property, with the invariable reply that all is OK and that I can carry on. This is testimony that the friendly folk who live along the roadway accept that they reside in an area that attracts image making individuals who need to explore to capture the ultimate image. I am one of these image making individuals.

My relationship with this route has not been without a little danger and close shaves, however. I have nearly been struck by lightning, almost driven into errant cattle, been cut by and stuck in barbed wire fences and had my vehicle mired in soft ground just metres off the hard shoulder. One accepts, however, that these trials are part of the overall whole and, without being too self assured; they can be seen as relatively trivial when compared to the reward that the end results bring.

I will continue to return to the region and hopefully be able to make and capture images that remain fresh and worthwhile, as well as rekindle the great relationships I have made over the years. For these reasons and the simple pleasure of being there, I will always hold the Maloti Route in highest esteem and regard it as one of my favourite pieces of tarmac.


#### When the editor takes leave ...




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
